MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR RESEARCH PROJECTS SPONSORED BY ESDP TRTI PUNE

Introduction:

Tribal Development Department Govt. of Maharashtra has directed its autonomous research and training arm, Tribal Research and Training Institute Pune to establish network of agencies and individuals to plan, monitor and control various training and research projects being funded under the financial aid received from the Govt. of Maharashtra.

Research and Training has been the mandate of the Institute and research pertaining to all aspects of tribal life and challenges faced by the public authorities involved in basic needs of tribal community are particularly encouraged by TRTI Pune.

Background:

TRTI Pune has been implementing Entrepreneurship and Skill Development Project (ESDP) since last few months with the help of network of training service providers and expert individuals as empaneled partners. The Empanelment Policy of TRTI-2018 is an on-going process wherein an individual or an institute eager to contribute in the broad areas of sustainable development goals adopted by the Govt. of India under UNDP program is allowed to participate and build knowledge, processes, and products and facilitate the tribal development.

Need:

ESDP-TRTI Pune aiming to skill and build capacities of about 50000 tribal youth in next three years has institutionalized the project and revenue region wise creation of network is under progress. There is specified number of each category of prospective institutional partners and individuals experts dedicating the expertise for tribal development. The financial budget allocated by TDD GoM for FY 2017-18 & 2018-19 and further developed by TRTI as per the mandate earmarks the component of research as important ESDP program sub-component.

Roles and Responsibilities of Party of First Part:

1. Identification of Research Agency or R & D centre /Expert Individual and scrutinizing the submitted proposals for conducting the preliminary visits/ meetings and interactions with the help of staff/subject matter experts empaneled by TRTI and discharging such services from time to time.
2. To accord the permission to use the name, logo of TRTI Pune to the party of second part for implementing project in research category sponsored by TRTI Pune.
3. To verify the proof of concept report / documentation of pilot project submitted along with the photographs and evidences supporting the necessary physical and human resources availability at the proposed centre. In case project needs upscaling or application of research studies completed and relevant to tribal welfare.
4. To receive and appraise proposal for conducting pilot project. Undertake technical and financial appraisal with the help of empaneled experts.
5. To accord the necessary sanction implementing research projects in the categories relevant to national challenges/sustainable development goals (SDGs) in general and tribal development in particular. The sponsor will establish linkages of periodic success parameters with the disbursement of funds as evolved & determined during consultative meetings in different stages of project execution.
6. To visit, monitor periodically for quality, take review from the end users/stakeholders of research project and carry on process for till the closure of the project.
7. To give feedback on the review and incorporation of suggestions as given by end users/stakeholders to better equip them for prospective benefits arising out of success parameters mutually defined by the

both the parties this may also include application of research studies, creation of IP, Collaboration with host/endorsement institutes etc..

8. To collect necessary information for research projects in IP creation, involvement of manpower in research activity, field visits, literature survey and link them with the disbursement of funds so as to ensure quality project completion.

9. To conduct periodic inspections and verify the documents, infrastructural change if effected by the training partner to ensure the quality and final outcome of research projects. To give feedback for incorporation of changes/modifications for ensuring deliverables committed by research agency/individual.

10. To hold meetings/discussions of party of second part jointly with end users/stakeholders in research project and ensure optimum resource utilization for tribal welfare.

Role and Responsibilities of Party of Second Part:

1. To prepare and submit the proposals as per affiliations secured by the party of second part aligning same with the mandate of both the parties.

2. To report in writing the mandatory requirements/ affiliations for the fulfillment of project with respect to accounts and audit needs of funding agency

3. To organize the human and material resources as per the standards of affiliating agency or multiple agencies as per the nature of research project

4. To complete the procedural formalities for establishing R & D centre which may be required by different Govt. entities with respect to technical equipment/s involved if any.

5. To ensure that manpower including PI & Co-PI are dedicated only to research project during its implementation and their professional charges earned for research project from Govt. grants do not violate the service conditions of Govt. organizations (Fully aided / grant-in-aid institutions).

6. In such an eventuality it will be the responsibility of party of second part to submit the No Objection Certificate (NOC) from employer institutes/host institutes.

7. The proposal will be submitted on-line in standard template with undertaking to fulfill all commitments in template, due diligence and this MoU document.

8. The progress reports agreed as per the Phase-I, II & III or relevant to project shall be submitted before lodging the claim for release of grants.

9. Documentation process for submission along with the utilization certificate for the grants shall be submitted in the prescribed format by Accounts Department TRTI Pune.

10. The complete research documentation shall be submitted inclusive of publication of books, articles and promotional material for propagating the research

11. The promotional collaterals like introductory letters, questionnaires, list of stakeholders, sample group and research methodology to be implemented shall be communicated if it deviates from the one given in standard template.

12. To create and register intellectual property in the name of TRTI Pune. In case the simultaneous registration of the property in the name of TRTI Pune is not possible, transfer the ownership after the conclusion of project.

13. To transfer the royalty/share of earning if the intellectual property is utilized jointly with some other IP created by proposer institute or its clientele.

14. To avoid use of name & logo of Tribal Development Dept. Govt. of Maharashtra and TRTI Pune for promoting other activities with commercial intent.

15. To avoid marketing of products, processes, technologies, books and publications of proposer Institute and its clientele.

16. To complete the statutory obligations informed by the funding agency due to promulgation of policy, bill, act relevant to the sanctioned project.

17. Idea / concept validation of other research project shall not be carried out in this project if some anomaly is found in other project and potential income source is located should be reported to sponsor.

18. To conduct all capacity building, sensitization interventions involved if any as per the standards and qualifications framework stipulated for respective field by Govt. of India.

19. The party of second part after executing the MoU shall attend the meetings / visit TRTI Pune for finalizing the methodology as deemed fit by sponsor.



TRTI, Pune shall form the arbitration committee headed by the Commissioner, TRTI Pune and the members nominated by him representing TRTI, Pune with inclusion of member/s from Training Provider.

The decision of arbitration committee shall be binding on both the parties.

27. Jurisdiction:

In case the decisions of Arbitration Committee are not acceptable to the parties, for the court proceedings shall be completed in Pune.

28. Termination of MoU:

TRTI, Pune may terminate or suspend this MoU in whole or in part for any material breach committed by party of second part. Any portion of the MoU which is not terminated or suspended shall remain in force and effect. The Party of First Part shall provide a prior written notice of one week and an opportunity of being heard to the Party of Second Part before the termination orders are issued by TRTI Pune.

29. Force Majeure:

a) This clause is mentioned to mean any unforeseeable or exceptional situation or event beyond the control of both the parties, preventing them or their agents, authorized representatives from fulfilling any of the obligations under this MoU and is not attributable to their negligence or error on their part, proving unsurmountable in spite of all due diligence.

b) Any of the party under MoU with Force Majeure shall inform other party without delay by registered letter with advice of delivery or equivalent, stating the nature, probable duration and foreseeable effects.

c) Neither TRTI Pune nor Party of the Second Part shall be held in breach of obligations under MoU, if they are prevented from fulfilling them by Force Majeure. Each of the party will make every effort to mitigate any losses suffered due to force majeure. In case either of the party fails to make the efforts for the mitigation of the losses other party will have right to terminate the MoU.



20. The party of second part shall fulfill all the terms and conditions of Tribal Development Dept. Govt. of Maharashtra and in the absence of same the terms stipulated in the policy of Ministry of Tribal Welfare Govt. of India shall be automatically made applicable.

21. Financial Assistance, Terms and Conditions of Release of Funds:

The party of the first part hereby agrees to financially assist the project titled conducting "Imparting Research Methodology Course for the students belonging to Scheduled Tribes through Webcast" to be implemented by party of second part commencing on 1st April 2020 and concluding on 30 November 2020 with last date for submission of documentation as 30 December 2020.

The TRTI Pune under ESDP scheme research component sanctions herewith Rs. 2,32,100 in accordance with the following terms and conditions and TRTI Pune requirements for accounts and audit purpose.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN TRIBAL RESEARCH AND TRAINING INSTITUTE AND INNOVATION AGENCY/EXPERT INDIVIDUAL (TRTI-IA/EI).

Introduction:

Tribal Development Department Govt. of Maharashtra has been sponsoring the Entrepreneurship and Skill Development Programs (ESDPs) for scheduled tribes in Maharashtra which were monitored by line offices and implemented by empaneled institutes with respective offices like Additional Tribal Commissioners/ITDP offices. The state has tribal population of 9.35% which is about 1Cr with the working age population as per demographic average of 65% stands at 65 Lakhs spread across the jurisdiction of 4 Additional Tribal Commissioner ate (ATCs) & 29 Integrated Tribal Development Projects (ITDPs.)



Roles and responsibilities of Party of the first Part:

1. Identification of Innovation Agency/Expert Individual and scrutinizing the submitted proposals for conducting the preliminary visits/ meetings and interactions with the help of staff/subject matter experts empaneled by TRTI and discharging such services from time to time.
2. To accord the permission to use the name, logo of TRTI Pune to the party of second part for implementing innovative project sponsored by TRTI Pune.

8. To collect necessary information for innovative projects in human capital creation, like candidate attendance, practical training photographs its manual & training and e-record like biometric attendance and CCTV footages for verification of attendance, internal and external assessments and link them with the disbursement of funds so as to ensure quality project completion.
9. To conduct periodic inspections and verify the documents, infrastructural change if effected by the training partner to ensure the quality of entrepreneurship and skill development programs.
10. To hold meetings/discussions of party of second part jointly with end users/stakeholders in innovative project and ensure optimum resource utilization for tribal welfare.

Role and Responsibilities of the Party of Second Part:

1. To conduct literature survey, prior search report for establishing the uniqueness in innovative projects in SDGs/ national priorities in tribal development. This may also include potential survey for income generation activities for STs in Maharashtra in the areas of employment, self-employment and entrepreneurship and come out with the documentation.
2. To establish delivery mechanism for innovative projects which has process/system innovation justifying the core objectives/success parameters.
3. To have following manpower for ensuring the smooth execution of innovative project. The table given is indicative presuming innovations for income generation through entrepreneurship/promotion of micro enterprises and may differ drastically based on the nature of innovative project submitted by the party of second part.

20. To attend review meetings and submit the progress report as and when demanded by TRTI Pune, to depute for such a meeting a competent representative authorized by the management to make on the spot decisions pertaining to ESDPs sponsored by TRTI Pune.

Mutually Agreed upon Success Parameters with timeline:

- A. To conduct field visits & carry out a survey in the tribal villages (pada's) of Mokhada & Jawhar tehsils of Palghar District to conduct need analysis.
- B. To identify the products that can be produced
- C. To develop superior, market oriented 'product designs'
- D. To build & execute capacity development & skill development programs on the basis of research being conducted.
- E. To develop sustainable business model for these products to be sold in the urban markets.
- F. Provide sustainable livelihood to 100 tribal people in the first phase at their native place

Financial Terms and Disbursement Schedule:

The training proposal is sanctioned for Rs. 20,00,000 /- for imparting training to 100 scheduled tribe candidates with execution period ending commencing on 20 December 2019 and orderly project closure date 31st December 2020. Under any circumstances the date of project closure shall not be extended and unspent/unutilized amount stands automatically surrendered from training partner to TRTI Pune.



21. To submit all documents for success parameters as defined during the consultative/discovery phase of innovative project being finalized for financial assistance from TRTI Pune.
22. To submit for innovative projects the proof for the Income generation, this could be by way of setting up self-employment/micro enterprise venture in post training phase.
23. The verification documents for clause number 24 like loan sanction letter may be under MUDRA, registration certificate under MSME (Udyami Adhar), Mumbai Shop and Establishment Act etc. Transactions by way of receipts/deposits in bank account in the name of business entity between Rs. 0.75-1.25 Lakhs between first 3-9 months.

Pune: The Centre for Emerging Economies has initiated a study in Palghar district to find out ways of developing a business model and market for the products the tribal population is skilled in making and preventing their migration to urban cities.

The Centre for Emerging Economies is a department of the Marathwada Mitraman-

dal's Institute of Education Research and Training, which has got a grant of Rs25 lakh from the Tribal Research Training Institute for the study in Palghar. Tribal Research Training Institute officiating commissioner Nandini Awade launched the project on Monday.

The management students and faculty of the institute would spend time with various tribal communities to help them enhance their pro-

duct development skills. The entire project will be held over 18 months.

"There are quite a few tribal communities, whose members are skilled in making decorative and utility products with paper pulp. The skill is not in use for nearly two decades. We want help the communities to develop products and create a market for them," said Sandeep Hegade, head of the Centre for Emerging Economies.



Research Survey Visit Report

Date of submission : 28th February, 2020

18 students and 3 faculty members of MM's IMERT visited Jawhar and Mokhada taluk in Palghar district of Maharashtra, from 7th February to 18th February 2020. The visit was part of the project that is funded and sanctioned by the Tribal Research and Training Institute (TRTI), Government of Maharashtra, to the Center for Emerging Economies (CEE) of MM's IMERT. The MOU was signed between MM's IMERT and Tribal Research and Training Institute (TRTI), Government of Maharashtra, at MM's IMERT. Hon. Prin. B.G. Jadhav Sir, Executive President, Marathwada Mitra Mandal, Hon. Shri. Kishor Mungale Sir, Secretary, Marathwada Mitra Mandal, Hon. Dr. Shriram Nerlekar Sir, Director, MM's IMER signed the MOU on behalf of the Institute. Hon. Dr. Milind Jagtap Sir, Hon. Dr. Sunil Deshpande Sir, Hon. Shri. Talathi Sir graced the occasion.

The project was launched formally on 7th January, 2020 at the hands of Hon. Prin. B.G. Jadhav Sir, Executive President, Marathwada Mitra Mandal, Hon. Smt. Nandini Awade Madam, Dy. Commissioner, TRTI, Hon. Dr. Rajas Parchure Sir, Officiating Director, Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics (Deemed to be University) and Hon. Dr. Shriram Nerlekar, Director MM's IMERT, Hon. Dr. Jitendra Bhandari, Present Director Incharge MM's IMERT in presence of all the faculty members and students of MM's IMERT and Hon. Principals/ Directors of other MM Institutions.

As per instructions of Hon. Dr. Shriram Nerlekar, the IQAC and the PPMC; the visit was planned from 7th February, 2020 to 18 February, 2020, considering further academic schedule and suitable climatic conditions. Accordingly due budget note was prepared and presented for approval through Director Sir, with his recommendation. Declaration forms and approval of parents of participating students were taken as per the guidance of Director Sir. All the teaching and non teaching staff of MM's IMERT were formally communicated about the schedule and other arrangements with approvals of Director Sir, HOD, MBA first year coordinator. Approval for students of MBA - MMCOE was availed through the HOD, MBA – MMCOE.

The lecture schedule for students participating in the visit was reorganized with approvals of In-charge Director, HOD MBA MMCOE and the MBA first year coordinator of MM's IMERT

Mr. Shailesh Mulay Office Superintendent, IMERT was formally roped in for arrangements of travel and insurance. The survey team received funds from the Marathwada Mitra Mandal, which is to be adjusted from the grant to be received from TRTI. The project received guidance from Hon. Prin. B. G. Jadhav Sir, Hon. Shri. Kishor Mungale Sir and other Hon. Trustees of MM group. Also worth mentioning the support and guidance was received from Hon. Dr. S. M. Deshpande Sir, Prin. MMCOE and all teaching and non teaching staff of IMERT and MBA – MMCOE.

The objective of the visit was to gather data about tribal population related to their education, skill set, occupation, income, life style, culture and traditions. The project objective is to generate the sustainable lively hood for the tribal people based on the locally available resources and the skill sets.

About 50 Students of IMERT and MMCOE directly or indirectly participated and supported the research survey. For visit the students were selected from among the MBA course first year students of IMERT as well as MMCOE. Majority of students belonged to Finance, Marketing, and HR specialization. The selection of students was made from a questionnaire and personal interview. The test and interview included the questions related to their research aptitude, social and general / business awareness, communication, teamwork and leadership, their past involvement and activities in the social spheres.

Ms. Snehal Kulkarni, Faculty - MMCOE, to accompany girl students communicated her inability due to sudden illness. Also, Ms Pranjal Jadhav, Faculty - IMERT communicated her inability to join as she too couldn't recover from her illness as she had thought. As there has to be a female faculty to accompany group of girls the visit planned for girl students was cancelled with the approval of In-charge Director Sir. Prof Dr. Uttam Sapate with the approval of In-charge Director Sir participated in the visit from 15th February to 18th

February 2020 with his wife, son & Ms Komal Dadas, Student Incharge of the Project Group through his personal vehicle.

The Jawhar and Mokhada districts are major tribal areas in the western Maharashtra. There are different tribes like Thakur, Koli, Kokana, Warli, Katkari etc. The tribal population in the area is more than 90%. There were 14 sectors identified for the survey. The geographical area covered was about 1170 Sq. Km. The everyday trail of each student and faculty was about 10 to 14 Km. by walk. The students and faculty members worked for around 15 hours a day as the day used to start at 5 a.m. and conclude at around 10 p.m. in the evening. The team worked in fluctuating climatic conditions over this period, experiencing cold as well as bright sun. The region is generally hilly with medium growth of grass, bushes and trees. Small clusters of the huts called 'Padas' in which the tribal live, are located randomly from a few to several kilometers apart. The road access is present but the conditions of road are not very good at some places, and some Padas are even not accessible by vehicles. The temperature of region ranged from pleasant 7 degree at night to about 35 degree in the afternoon sun, exhausting the surveyors trying to cover as much of planned area as possible. Sometimes the location required on foot journey from hill top to hill top or to the depth of a steep ravine. February is at the start of summer season, when local women folk wander in quest of water, which may be found only at select places, kilometers far from Padas and at riverbeds deep down from their hilltop huts.

Faculty and Management envisaged this activity as an opportunity for the 'Project Based Learning' for the students. Students were briefed about project objectives, visit objectives, and the outcomes expected. Having understood the unique and innovative opportunity for practical learning, students were full of enthusiasm and energy right from the start. They started working in groups for planning the sector visits during their 10 day visit. For the planning, students contacted government departments located at Jawhar and Nasik. Students also got in touch with the Anganwadi Sevikas in the sectors, about 5/10 each, for on the ground information. With this information and using the Google Map students planned day wise travel locations and kilometers, Padas and Tribes to target, and general local information regarding no. of Padas, population, road conditions, internal distances etc. This was very crucial for optimizing the travel time and safe journey in the minibus arranged by students for Pune to Pune journey.

Students took several initiatives on their own, even before the start of their journey for the survey. Students put empty boxes in all the 4 MM group campuses in Pune and appealed the students, faculty and staff to donate stationary, toys, used garments etc. for donation. The material thus collected was about 12 full gunny sacks. Also students collected money voluntarily as their own contribution. With this own contribution students purchased the stationary items, books and notebooks at wholesale market in Pune, after a steep bargain. At several places on daily basis, the said items were distributed by students – toys for the children, stationary to the students, and clothing for every one of all age group and gender. The Joy and delight on the faces was an appreciation and bonus outcome for students beyond the planned ones.

The whole hearted cooperation and important role of the Anganwadi Sevikas, and several local persons was felt by the students and they decided to reward them with a 'Certification of Recognition' for their selfless efforts. Also as a part of team building initiative students designed and made T shirts for their own use with the Name / Logo of Marathwada Mitra Mandal, IMERT and CEED.

For the project outcomes to be innovative and sustainable, IMERT has collaborated with IIT Mumbai. The role of IIT is to develop the innovative product and process that can be manufactured locally by the beneficiaries. The products developed and manufactured will be marketed in and out of country at various platforms and channels with the resources and expertise available at IMERT. Two professors of IIT Mumbai joined the survey team on location for two days. During this time experts visited different Padas and talked at length with tribal artisans. They also conducted a session for students, as a module of the 'Design Thinking' course, for which the students will be certified by IIT and IMERT on the completion. After the

session students are given practical assignments and small projects in the groups that will prove helpful for students in planning and development of product for their business. The assignment includes need analysis and market potential studies to be undertaken by student groups.

The project team also received support from the government offices related to tribal development, located at Pune, Nasik and Mumbai. These offices provided valuable data, guidance and permissions required for the planning and execution of the survey schedule. During the visit students had opportunity to interact with the IAS officer, and the government Project Development Officers in the project area. The sessions were interactive and students asked questions related to career, government policies and programs, past results and future plans etc. The student team had visited various ongoing project sites locations during the visit. They interviewed the workers, supervisors present at the site e.g. Nalabandi, Gharkul, canal, bridge and road building, pipe laying work under MNREGA and such Govt. schemes. This first hand observation and information gathered at the site and subsequent interaction with the higher officers imparted deep insights for the students regarding Government programs and execution. The question answer session focused on specific problems and Govt. programs for the tribal areas.

There are many NGOs working in the project area, some even for 50 years. These NGOs generally focus on one area or aspects of tribal problems and development. Our team visited such NGO offices and their project locations for sharing of the valuable information and insights they gained through their work. The project sites of NGO included Central Kitchen facility for group of Ashram Shala, Plantation and poly house projects, Rainwater harvesting, Nala or Bandh projects, seed bank etc. Through such interactions the students were exposed to the sensitivity required for the work in social development and also the work culture in NGO sector. NGO sector is fast becoming significant in India, replacing/ augmenting the government and corporate efforts and seen as potential recruiters for students of professional courses like MBA.

Also note worthy was the introduction of students to Self Help groups in the area. The SHG are found to play a significant role at the grass root level, carrying out the supporting activities for the NGO and Govt. schemes and programs. Students had a chance to talk with SHG members.

The core part of the survey consisted of meeting and talking with tribal at their own place, understanding their life and environment, education and aspirations, traditions and social structures, development and challenges. Students worked together with the MMCOE Engineering students to develop an Android Based Mobile Application. Before leaving for the survey students developed, improved and tested the App. This App can work in on line and offline modes, a precaution necessary because of the remote Padas not being accessible by most of the networks in project area. Students recorded about 400 individual input data and 125 community level data points through this application during the visit. This in itself is an achievement of student's collaborative efforts and team work in meeting the project objectives.

For 3 to 4 days before the scheduled departure date, every evening student counted, packaged and labeled the donation material. When distributing on the location, it proved to be very helpful as the volunteers could pick up the packaged and labeled garments, stationary or toys that are identified with age group and gender, without any trouble. The joy and satisfaction on the faces of people and their good wishes justified the sentiments of original donors from Pune, and the students who took pains to travel campuses, talked with student, faculty and in their social circles, and package the donations.

Given the high standards for achievement and challenge of working for innovative social cause in unknown areas, boosted the moral of students. On the day of departure all students were ready at college campus at 4.30 am, with personal and common luggage/ packages loaded on the bus. Earlier students had gone through traffic and travel arrangements and minute details. Our bus driver was an important part of team and counsel on the matters of routes, road conditions, time, and alternatives on group formation for the purpose of covering Padas scattered in all directions among the hills. It was towards the end of 10 day visit, that the students discovered the bus also had internal audio system and player. Throughout the tour the

behavior and mindset of students showed different hues like - research explorer, curious data gatherer, active listener and sympathizer of problems, student of public policy and economic studies, etc. and above all a committed person to achieve the objectives.

The routine was quite tough. In order to leave the dormitories with lunch pack for the day in Tiffin, students had to get up not later than 5 a.m. in the morning. The dormitory provided comfortable night sleep, sanitary facilities, sumptuous breakfast and meals and picturesque surroundings. The auditorium with audio visual facility was used for the inputs from IIT experts, Government Development Officers, or interaction with local experts and researchers in the area of tribal development. When not very busy, students also enjoyed an inning of cricket on the ground. Every day after dinner, all gathered to exchange and narrate the day's happenings, special mentions. It used to be the time to consolidate the days learning, and plan for the tomorrow. The faculty guided the students, asked for the health update, as some times students are not allowed to participate or permitted-on-request to remain behind and not be part of the day's activities on medical grounds.

Having achieved better than expected result in this phase, we are now preparing for the next phase of the project. In this stage the challenge is to identify and develop saleable products and their processes, and prepare the ground work for their production. The learning now shifts to the marketing and operations domains. We are dependent on many collaborators. Their input as well as cooperation, is essential for the success. We are confident about the ability of the students. They have learned much and showed exceptional abilities in gaining practical knowledge and developing skills through the exposure in this phase. To sum up, the phase one was uneventful, in the sense that everything went just about as planned. We look forward to the same feat of management learning and execution from the students in the coming days.

Students have been thankful to the institute for such an opportunity to understand business from the core. Especially, many parents communicated their appreciation towards efforts put in by the institute for the holistic development of students. The work accomplished in this phase will enable students to generate output in the form of presentations, slide shows, project reports, research papers etc. We plan to create opportunities for the student to display their abilities and further built their capabilities. We thank everyone who directly or indirectly helped in our endeavor and to our students who made this possible.
